Thirty-four individuals will be recognized before the Board of Supervisors on Tuesday to celebrate the conclusion of the first ever Mendocino County Leadership Academy.

The Academy was the vision of the County CEO, Carmel J. Angelo, as a means of providing opportunities for up-and-coming leaders in the organization to expand their leadership potential. Since its inception in 2011, the Leadership Development Initiative has grown to encompass more than 75 participants (including Board members), representing over 18 County departments.


