






Childhood Experiences vs. Adult Alcoholism




Mendocino County ACE Scores

- Average ACE score of 3
- 28.4 percent of Mendocino County children living below poverty
- Rate of confirmed cases of child abuse
- (17.9 per 1,000) is 8th highest in State
- More than double the statewide average (8.7 per 1,000)



FRCs provide VOCA Allowable Costs for Direct Services


- Immediate Health and Safety services
