Previous Board/Board Committee Actions:					
■ SUMMARY OF REQUEST: AB 2395 would remove our rural communities' right to choose traditional home phone service. The bill would allow a telephone corporation, such as AT&T, to withdraw voice telephone (traditional home phone) service after January 1, 2020; delay the requirement for the CPUC to design a universal connectivity program; and does not provide for public participation in withdrawal requests. AB 2395 could potentially leave many of our residents without telephone service in the event of a power outage, and take away the most reliable way to reach 911 in an emergency. Additionally, passage could mean inferior service and little, if any, competitive choice with respect to telephone service.
