II. BRIEF SUMMARY:

This contract will serve all children in Mendocino County currently in the Child Welfare System and community at large. CFSOC will partner with First 5, who has already begun training for the 0-5 years population and the medical community. This will continue the First 5 training, and expand it to include children in the 5 and above category. Trainings will include professionals, parents, and guardians who work with foster and adoptive children within Title 4E regulations. Training will include new and refresher courses for those working with court dependents and families; necessary skills to maintain records and administrative duties attached to Foster Care programs; foundational knowledge of direct care, intervening with children and families in crisis, innovative services to meet the needs of challenging clients, conflict resolution, staff retention, safety issues and more. The resulting training will in turn support the County Strategic Plan to build comprehensive and consistent parenting skills through out our community to better prepare parents in raising healthy, happy, productive children.
