Each of these individuals is an active volunteer with the sole provider of EMS ground transportation in the Anderson Valley Ambulance service area of Mendocino County. As volunteers, they are willing to serve as ambulance drivers, but are not prepared to become direct patient care providers.

This area is a rural and sparsely populated portion of Mendocino County. The district extends from the Sonoma County line to the South, MP 48.46 Highway 128 to the East, from MP 8.08 to the West, and MP 10.0 highway 253 to the North. This is a 40-mile long valley with a mountaintop-to-mountaintop catchment area of approximately 15 miles across through most of the valley.

Mendocino County's unincorporated population is well below the 125,000 person requirement of this section as per the latest federal census.

There is an immediate need to enable the above listed individuals to drive the volunteer ambulance in order to continue to provide locally based EMS services in Anderson Valley and surrounding service areas.
