Presently, leachate (water that has come in contact with buried solid waste) must be hauled to a licensed treatment plant in compliance with operating permits from North Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board (NCRWQCB) and Cal Recycle - formerly California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB). MCDoT will conduct a consultant selection process and return to the Board with an exact budget and scope of work to be performed under the Agreements. Caspar Landfill is co-owned with the City of Fort Bragg. Pursuant to the City/County Joint Powers Agreement, MCDoT discussed the issue with the Joint Coordinating Committee (JCC) on March 14, 2012. Options were proposed by the JCC that included a phased approach with a fatal flaws analysis prior to a full Request for Proposal (RFP) for specialized consultant services (to modify the existing leachate disposal system to include some or all treatment and disposal on site verses hauling to a wastewater treatment plant) – see alternative action. The City of Fort Bragg can also provide input through future meetings of the JCC before concluding negotiations on final scope and cost with the potential consultant to perform the work.
