AGENDA TITLE: Adoption of Proclamation Recognizing April 28, 2012, as Workers' Memorial Day in Mendocino County

- **PREVIOUS BOARD/BOARD COMMITTEE ACTIONS:** The Board of Supervisors routinely adopts proclamations recognizing special events and meritorious achievements.
- SUMMARY OF REQUEST: Supervisors Brown and McCowen are requesting adoption of the Proclamation recognizing April 28, 2012, as Workers' Memorial Day in Mendocino County. The first Worker's Memorial Day was observed in 1989 with April 28th being chosen in recognition of the anniversary of adoption of the Occupational Safety and Health Administration and in accordance with a similar remembrance day in Canada.

Every year on April 28th people in communities and at worksites recognize workers who have been killed, injured, or permanently disabled in the line of duty due to workplace injuries and occupational disease.

Locally, Workers' Memorial Day is being sponsored by the North Bay Central Labor Council, AFL-CIO, and the Workers Memorial Fund steering committee. Workers' Memorial Day will be observed in our community with a gathering at the Saturday Afternoon Clubhouse, located at 107 South Oak Street, Ukaih, on Saturday, April 28, at 5:00 p.m.
