GLENN SUNKETT SENTENCED TO 63 YEARS IN STATE PRISON

On July 10, 2008, Michael Bennett was returning to his residence with his friend Max Stover. The two got out of their vehicle and were confronted by three men who assaulted and beat Bennett. Stover was handcuffed and Bennett, semi-conscious, was dragged into the house. They were kept hostage along with two other occupants in the home. All four were bound and demands were made for money and marijuana with threats to kill Bennett. At one time a butane torch was used to threaten other occupants. The four were eventually taken into a room, bound and locked inside. When they broke free they took Bennett to the hospital. Money, marijuana and cell phones were taken and the house was ransacked. Through exhaustive investigation, Defendant Glenn Sunkett was identified as a suspect. Further investigation and identification by one of the victims led to his arrest in Oakland.

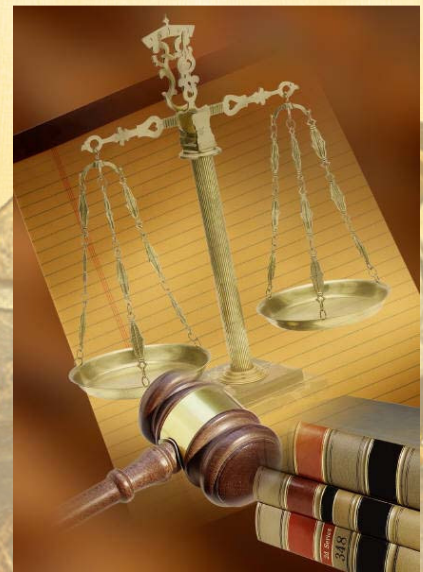
Defendant Glenn Sunkett was convicted by jury of residential robbery, violations of Penal Code sections 221/212.5/213(A)(1)(A) as to each victim alleged (Dusty Miller, Michael Bennett, Mathew Graves, and Max Stover), as well as kidnapping, section 207(a), and false imprisonment by force, section 236. It was further found true that he was armed within the meaning of Penal Code section 12022.53(b) and 12022(a). The jury further convicted Sunkett of residential burglary of an inhabited dwelling within the meaning of Penal Code section 459, two violations of Penal Code section 422 (criminal threats), and one violation of section 12021 (felon in possession of a firearm). The verdicts occurred on June 29, 2009.

Sunkett sought to have his trial attorney, Public Defender Linda Thompson removed from his case. Those efforts failed until the court finally appointed C. David Eyster to represent him. After extensive delays, Eyster filed a motion for a new trial. The motion was litigated and summarily denied, after which the defendant was sentenced to 63 years in state prison.

District Attorney Lintott said that this verdict and sentenced reflect the intolerance of this community for those who would come here to commit violent acts. "We will continue to vigorously prosecute and hold those accountable who prey upon our citizens," Lintott said. Sunkett was prosecuted by Chief Deputy DA Jill Ravitch.

TIMOTHY RYAN JR. WAS FOUND GUILTY OF MOLESTATION CHARGES

On October 7, 2010, a Mendocino County Jury returned guilty verdicts on all counts against Timothy Russell Ryan, 29 years old, of Willits, after 4 days of trial. The case originated from molestations reported in the Willits Area in April 2008. The defendant was convicted of providing a 13 year old girl marijuana and then committing sexual acts upon her on 3 occasions. The first case hearings happened in late 2008, but the case was delayed

almost a year when the defendant was arrested on marijuana charges in Orange County, which resulted in felony convictions.

When the defendant returned to Mendocino County, the case proceeded to trial. Testimony included the victim, her mother, detectives and a person to whom the defendant had bragged about molesting the young girl. There is a potential sentencing of 15 years 4 months for these charges. Sentencing date is scheduled for December 13th. Ryan was prosecuted by Deputy District Attorney Shannon Cox.

CASE OUTCOMES ♦ GUILTY PLEAS ♦ TRIALS

- Darvel Blackwell was sentenced to 5 years state prison after pleading guilty to an assault with a firearm. *(Prosecuted by DDA Hubley)*
- Ivan Gaona pled guilty to possession for sale and was sentenced to 5 years state prison. *(Prosecuted by DDA Houston)*
- Jerome Montgomery was found guilty of a felony charge of intimidating a victim and five prison priors along with a felony strike prior and was sentenced to 8 years state prison. *(Prosecuted by DDA Jackson)*
- Christopher Skaggs pled guilty to possession of concentrated cannabis and failure to comply with a uniformed peace officer. Mr. Skaggs was sentenced to 16 months state prison. *(Prosecuted by DDA Larson)*
- Hoan Huynh pled guilty to auto theft and possession of stolen property. Huynh was sentenced to 2 years state prison. *(Prosecuted by DDA Stoen)*
- Michael Taylor was sentenced to 6 years state prison after pleading guilty to assault with a deadly weapon. *(Prosecuted by DDA Killion)*
- Olen Sowers pled guilty to two felony cases. Sowers pled to a felony charge of possession for sale with a felony prior which he received a sentenced of 16 months state prison and on the second case he pled to a felony possession of stolen property and was sentenced to 6 months state prison. *(Prosecuted by DDA Newman)*
