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SMALL AMOUNT OF H1N1 VACCINE RECEIVED BY COUNTY GOING TO LOCAL MEDICAL PROVIDERS

Ukiah, CA – Last week Mendocino County Community Health Services (CHS) received 600 doses of H1N1 FluMist vaccine and 300 doses of inactivated H1N1 vaccine. After careful consideration, the CHS Disaster Preparedness H1N1 Team will distribute the allotment to the three local hospitals: Ukiah Valley Medical Center, Frank Howard Memorial Hospital, and Mendocino Coast District Hospital; and to ten medical providers.

The H1N1 vaccine is targeted for:

1. Pregnant Women,
2. Household contacts and caregivers of children less than 6 months of age,
3. Healthcare and emergency medical service personnel, and
4. All children age 2 to 10 years

CHS is not conducting H1N1 vaccination clinics at this time. Please contact your medical provider to inquire about vaccinating yourself.
