This class works under limited supervision and performs a variety of skilled and progressively complex carpentry tasks in the construction and maintenance of buildings and furniture. Work is performed at an advanced journey level, and incumbents in this class are expected to work with considerable independence, with their work being subject only to periodic spot checks.

Performs general construction and remodeling of building and other related structures.

Constructs cabinetry, bookcases, furniture, and other projects.

Assists in the general maintenance of County offices and buildings.

Supervises inmates, work release and community service individuals in the performance of carpentry duties.

Performs a variety of related tasks at an advanced journey level, under general supervision.

Carries lead worker responsibilities, including day-to-day direction, scheduling, and training.

Advises managerial staff in the technical aspects of the job functions.

Performs other related duties as assigned.
