Under general supervision, primary responsibilities include the performance of kennel duties related to the physical well being of animals contained in the animal facility.

This class is distinguished from the Animal Control Assistant by the performance of clerical and dispatching duties performed by the Animal Control Assistant.

SUPERVISION EXERCISED:

Exercises no supervision.

- Clean and disinfect kennels, euthanasia area, and animal crematorium.
- Feed and water animals daily.
- Observe animals for signs of disease.
- Administer approved vaccines.
- Assist with administering approved euthanasia drugs for the euthanasia of animals.
- Conduct inventory of supplies, assist in the preparation of supply orders and stock supplies.
- · Maintain records, reports and files.
- Clean and maintain animal facility office and grounds.
- Performs other related duties as assigned.

Mental and Physical Ability to:

- Establish and maintain effective working relationships with a variety of individuals.
- Learn animal behavior and disease symptoms such as rabies and related common diseases.
- Understand and carry out oral and written instructions.
- Deal with problems involving a few variables in standardized situations.
- While performing the essential functions of this job the employee is regularly required to stand, walk, use hands to finger, handle, or feel, reach with hands and arms, stoop, kneel, bend, crouch, or crawl, and speak and hear.
- While performing the essential functions of this job the employee is frequently required to lift and/or move up to 100 pounds.
- While performing the essential functions of this job the employee is occasionally required to use color, sound, odor and shape perception and discrimination.

Working Conditions:

- While performing the essential functions of this position, the employee is regularly exposed to fumes or airborne particles, and toxic or caustic chemicals.
- The incumbent's working conditions are typically loud.
