New Device Installation

NSPS wood heater* (Make and Model)

An NSPS device MUST be listed as NSPS certified by EPA under the Regulatory Clean Air Act program.

Pellet Stove or insert (Make and Model)

Device must be designed exclusively for pellets and the manual must state that burning of cordwood violates federal law.

Device approved by another California Air Quality Regulatory agency under an emissions reduction program. Provide device Make and Model and Agency.

A dated and legible copy of the letter allowing the device from the California Agency MUST be attached. Devices which have received MCAQMD approval in the past only need to provide a copy of an approval letter from the District.

Loss replacement

The District allows the replacement of non-approved devices if the home is lost due to fire or other accidents. Please attach a brief letter outlining incident.

Historic structure exemption

The District Regulation provides an exemption for historic structures which are recognized by local, state or federal authorities. If you wish to claim an historic structure exemption please attach a short letter and a copy of any official documentation.

* Many devices marketed as "EPA approved" or "Phase II certified devices" DO NOT meet the NSPS standard. The EPA "burnwise" program is a voluntary certification which does not meet the NSPS regulatory standard. Only devices that meet the July 1, 1990 standard NSPS are allowed.
